



Allergy/Asthma Student Checklist

Child **CAN NOT** attend school without medication(s) and proper paperwork.

Medication

- Brand new, unopened medication in original packaging.
- Prescription label included (unless over the counter medication) with the child's name listed.

Forms

Required for students with allergies:

- (1) *Allergy & Anaphylaxis Medication Administration Authorization Plan* **signed** by doctor which lists **ALL** medications being stored at school (For example, if your child has an EpiPen and Benadryl you list BOTH items)
 - Child's photo in upper right-hand corner so can be easily identified by all staff
- Medication Administration Authorization Form* **signed** by doctor- There needs to be (1) form for **EACH** medication. For example, if you have an EpiPen and Benadryl, you must have (2) Medication Administration forms; one for each.
 - Child's photo in upper right-hand corner so can be easily identified by all staff

Required for students with inhalers at school:

- Asthma Action Plan* **signed** by doctor. Must accompany *Allergy & Anaphylaxis Medication Administration Authorization Plan* and *Medication Administration Authorization Form* (if allergy induced asthma)

Required for other medical conditions which could occur at school, (ex: heart condition, low blood sugar, etc.)

- Please contact the front office for proper paperwork**

- Please Check Medication Expiration Dates
- Each Medication Must be Labeled with Original Prescription Label (unless over the counter). This includes the Label on an EpiPen Box with Child's Name Listed.
- All Forms Must Be Signed by a Doctor.
- MHNS Can Not Keep Any Medications on Premises Without the Proper Paperwork.
- All of the Above Forms Need to be Submitted Every School Year; If You're a Returning Student MHNS Needs All New Forms.
